Our big, audacious, moonshot (but totally achievable) goal:

58,000 homes by **2030**

Our report, How Much Housing Do We Need?, shows that we're 38,000 homes behind right now, and will need 20,000 more by 2030. Building in Sonoma County has not kept up with job and population growth for over 2 decades, and we have 3 low-wage jobs for every



- 60% of Sonoma County's
 residents are "cost burdened,"
 meaning they pay more than
 30% of their income on housing,
 leaving them unable to meet
 their other basic needs. Over
 50% of our low wage earners
 are "severely cost burdened,"
 meaning they pay more than
 half their incomes on housing.
- 1 in 4 children live in overcrowded homes.
- 1 in 4 Latinos live in overcrowded homes, a rate 10X greater than for whites.
- Our housing crisis
 disproportionality impacts
 our communities of color;
 this is an enduring result of
 the structural inequities in
 housing policy and housing
 finance systems.
- Paying too much for housing, or living in overcrowded conditions, has serious health consequences and negatively impacts educational outcomes.
- Our housing crisis stifles our local economy and increases traffic and our greenhouse gas emissions.

our RESULTS

- We advance policy solutions:
 - The policy solutions we champion will spur production by reducing cost barriers to multi-family housing development, desegregate our community by ending exclusionary zoning and prioritizing high-resource areas for affordable, multi-family housing, and create more types of housing for our students, young families, and workforce members by zoning for "Missing Middle" Housing.
- We educate, engage, and organize
 the public and our community
 leaders to build a pro-housing ethic
 and raise a counter voice to the
 housing opposition.
- We make sure that great new housing communities are no longer slowed down—or abandoned —because of anti-housing pushback or unnecessary bureaucratic hurdles.
- We strengthen the political will of our elected and appointed officials, and help them make evidence-based decisions through education and relevant research.
- We collaborate with other organizations to attract more grant funding and private investment in local housing development.

- Led the efforts to attract \$170 Million to Sonoma County for affordable and climate-smart housing.
- 4,397 Generation Housing endorsed-housing units
 have been entitled (earned approval to build); nearly
 half will have rents set by law to serve our lower-wage
 workforce members.
- Published several research reports relied on by our local leaders, most recently, the State of Housing in Sonoma County, and produced a number of quality educational events for those leaders and the public.
- Hosted 36 educational events on housing and how housing intersects with our community's and community members' health and prosperity.
- Held monthly "house parties" and published monthly newsletters to keep our members, followers, and community members up to date on housing issues and engaged in solutions.
- Built a pro-housing Gen H Action Team: Generation
 Housing rallies our individual members to deliver our
 messages and our community leaders across sectors
 to amplify their voices and increase our impact.
 The Action Team allies to support good policy
 decisions and good housing projects when needed.
- Developed a strong reputation with local media and community decision- and policymakers as a leader and trusted authority on housing issues.
- Launched the county-wide public will building campaign #WeAreGenH, broadly supported by local media and organizations across sectors, guided by research and created by social justice marketing experts, with the aim of associating housing with people to create a deep and lasting pro-housing ethic.
